Snyderville Basin Bus Service A Go!

Snyderville Basin residents overwhelmingly voted in support of the establishment of bus service into several Basin neighborhoods. On the Nov. 4th ballot, Basin residents were asked two questions: whether they would like to establish a new Transit District and whether sales taxes within the new district should be increased to fund the transportation measure. Of the 924 ballots cast, 729, or 80 percent supported formation of the district.

Park City residents were not eligible to vote on the transit district. Only Snyderville Basin residents, excluding those who live in Glenwild, Promontory and The Colony were polled. Those gated communities requested not to be included in the transit district. Only businesses in the Basin Transit District, not Park City, will see a tax hike.

Three new bus routes will likely be established by next summer, as Summit County commissioners support initiating the service when the school year ends next spring. One route will serve Pinebrook and possibly Jeremy Ranch. Another bus would cross north over Interstate 80 and serve areas along Bitner Road and then cross under the Interstate onto Highland Drive. That route would then wrap through Highland Estates and Silver Summit west of U.S. 40, serving the Trailside area along the way. The third route expands a bus route leaving Park City along S.R. 224, to include dense residential areas in Silver Springs.

Trail Talk



The Swaner Nature Preserve is working with the Army Corps of Engineers to bridge East Canyon Creek with the existing Spring Creek Trail. Once approved, the Canyon Creek access will offer signs explaining rules and laws for fishermen, as well as ecosystem preservation points. A trail and walkway that continue north into East Canyon Creek are also under review.

The Cobblelane Loop, on the north side of the Glenwild Trail, was built last summer and provides three miles of new trails. The Loop will eventually connect into Jeremy Ranch,

The Swaner Nature Preserve is most likely by the spring of working with the Army Corps 2004.

The Snyderville Basin Recreation District along with Red Hawk is constructing a trail from Jeremy Ranch to the Glenwild Stealth Trail, adding biker access and new terrain to those living in the Canyon Creek Club, Spring Creek and Blackhawk neighborhoods.

Money Magazine names Park City Top Vacation Spot

Money Magazine featured Park City in its "Best Places to Vacation-Winter 2003" issue, which hit newsstands on Oct. 21, 2003.
